### A note from our executive director

Dear Friends,

Part of what makes the Center for Rural Affairs an effective organization is our constantly evolving work. For instance, after decades as a small business lender, we saw a need for more diverse capital solutions, and in 2020 made a decision to expand our lending.

We've since added loans for single-family homes, multifamily housing development, and small meat processors. These new areas of lending help keep communities vibrant and improve quality of life.

The response has been strong. This year, we crossed the \$40 million mark in community-based lending since making our first small business loan in the early 1990s. More than \$11 million of that came in the last year alone. In 2025, we will roll out low-income solar and other climate-related lending, and also expand our food systems lending.

Our evolving approach to lending, alongside our policy change and community development work, will lead to greater impact for you and your community. Thank you for your support. It makes this work possible.

### Your 2024 accomplishments

- Shared resources from our Clean Energy Siting Library with more than 60 counties exploring renewable energy development.
- Lent \$2.5 million to families purchasing or fixing their homes since making our first mortgage loan in December 2021.
- Served 90 veterans from across America through our agritourism cohort, which included farm store tours, education, and networking. Cohort leaders launched the Nebraska chapter of the Farmer Veteran Coalition.
- Amplified rural voices by inviting you to call, email, and meet with policymakers at all levels of government, from county boards to the halls of Congress.
- Hosted 40 industry-specific academies focusing on how to run a business in rural America's most in-demand fields, such as child care, construction, and restaurants.
- Held the second annual Organic Transition Academy as part of a 6-state cooperative that provides support for transitioning and existing organic farmers.

- Brought opportunity to Tribal entrepreneurs and provided a community gathering space through two makerspaces—one each in Santee and Walthill, Nebraska.
- Empowered more than 2,000 participants through small business training and one-on-one sessions. Each entrepreneur provides a boost to main streets.
- Produced innovative agrisolar resources, showcasing how farms can harvest both crops and sunlight. These dual-use practices prove that fertile fields can double as clean energy hubs, revolutionizing rural landscapes.
- Fueled local food economies with two loans totaling \$6.3 million made to small meat and poultry processors. Access to capital lets family-owned processors expand and update facilities to stay competitive.
- Educated farmers on specialty and organic crop insurance, a crucial tool for financial stability amid an unpredictable climate. We reached more than 450 people via presentations, webinars, podcasts, and personalized consultations.

- Strengthened rural communities through entrepreneurship and homeownership by placing more than \$40 million in small business and home loans since beginning lending in 1993.
- Rallied grassroots support to amend lowa's Meat and Poultry Inspection Act, which will allow state-licensed poultry processors to offer custom processing and streamline regulations upon USDA approval.
- Joined the Heartland Food Business Center, a six-state, 30-partner consortium, to increase business development assistance to small, mid-size, and diverse food and farm entrepreneurs.
- Financed a 10-unit apartment complex in Grand Island, Nebraska, to provide quality housing for new immigrants and refugees.
- Established a Nebraska-wide mentorship program connecting experienced farmers with newcomers. We aim to boost conservation while maintaining productivity by promoting soil-friendly practices like no-till farming, cover crops, and managed grazing.

#### **Rural Grocery Vitality**

Rural grocery stores play a pivotal role in local economies and healthy diets. Yet, independently owned stores face shrinking margins, aging infrastructure, and big-box competition. We're working with Nebraska legislators and local leaders to develop solutions to keep them open.
